ADDISCOMBE **WELCOMES** REFUGEES

This is a community

sponsorship group, based at Our Lady's Catholic Church on Bingham Road in Addiscombe. Addiscombe Welcomes Refugees is part of the UK Government's community sponsorship scheme, which enables communities to be directly involved in the resettlement of refugees in need of protection in the UK. In the next few months they will be supporting a vulnerable refugee family from Syria to rebuild their lives in Croydon.

They would like to give them the best chance of settling well into our community and having a new place they can call home. Finding suitable accommodation is the number one the priority at moment. They are eager to speak to landlords who may have a suitable house, which will be available to rent in the next few weeks, ideally a 3-bed self-contained property. They can offer them guaranteed rent for two years.

The charity RESET have also made a brilliant 3-minute video in which two landlords speak about their experience of renting to refugees.
